Subject: Recommendation for an Increase in Change Order Authority for the Materials

Contract with Ferguson Enterprises, Inc. for the Construction of the

Distribution System Phase 1 (IGU IFB 2015-G-05) (\$40,000.00)

IGU has competitively solicited an Invitation for Bid for the above referenced project. IGU received only one (1) bid, which was awarded to Ferguson Enterprises, Inc. for a total of \$308,304.78 on March 27, 2015 (BM No. 2015-08). In conjunction with this award, the Board authorized the General Manager a change order authority in the not to exceed amount of \$15,000.00. This Board Memorandum requests an increase in the change order authority an additional \$40,000.00 for a total

12 | not to exceed amount of \$55,000.00.

The project was for the procurement and delivery of HDPE valve, HDPE fittings, and locates material of HDPE gas pipe ranging in size from 2 inches to 8 inches for work in Phase 1 located within North Pole, Alaska and the surrounding area. Procurement of these materials assured IGU of the quality of fittings to be installed in the system, as well as the consistency and compatibility between the various stages of the project's construction. Materials per the original contract have been received and are being used in the construction of the distribution system that is currently underway with substantial completion of work scheduled for mid-to-late September 15, 2015.

This change order authority request is being made to allow for purchase of additional materials that will allow for the completion of the three zones of the Distribution System Phase 1 projects. Included in these additional material purchases are:

- 1. 8-inch and 4-inch electrofusion high volume tapping tees and pups to allow the conformed installation of the tees across all three zones of Phase 1. The three contractors installing the fittings are unable to use the originally purchased saddle tees for this part of the work. The saddle tees are able to be taken into IGU inventory and used on future phases of the work.
- 2. 12 each 8-inch and 4-inch clamps need to install the above electrofusion tees. These clamps will be the property of IGU and are able to be used for the future phases of the distribution system.
- 3. 8-inch, 4-inch and 2-inch (2,220) additional splice kits for fusing the distribution piping together. The original order for materials was predicated on an estimate of how many splices might be made versus heat fusion of pipe joints, particularly in light of not knowing how much open trench work would be accomplished as compared to directional drilling. The contractors were not mandated as to number of slices could be made by electrofusion versus heat fusion; as a result, IGU has insufficient quantities of these materials to meet the contractors' planned approach of using more electrofusion than heat fusion. Excess materials will be usable on the future project phases.
- 4. 27,500 linear feet of tracer wire to replace an equivalent quantity borrowed from Enstar Natural Gas Company in order to keep the distribution contractor moving forward on their work.
- 5. 1,000 linear feet of 1-inch HDPE pipe for tracer wire installation on longer directional bores required to be made under state roadways and or railroad embankments.
- 6. Additional expedited shipping costs.

The foregoing material increases are generally a result of unknown methods and means to be practiced by the general contractors installing the three zones of the distribution system, as well as replacing materials that Enstar Natural Gas Company graciously loaned to IGU. The current change order

1 authority authorized to the General Manager is \$15,000; therefore it is requested that this authorization 2 limit without further Board approval be increased to \$40,000.00 for a total not to exceed amount of 3 \$55,000.00. Subject: Request for Authority to extend Sole Source contract with RJG for

Professional Services for Accounting (NTE \$22,000.00)

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This request is for authorization to extend the existing agreement with RJG for accounting services an additional six months at a cost of no more than \$22,000 bringing the contract total not to exceed \$53,800. Ongoing services will include transaction processing, payroll processing as may be needed, and reporting through December 31, 2015 as defined in the engagement letter attached. RJG has also offered to extend the agreement for an additional 6 months through June 30, 2016 if the IGU is unable to issue an RFP and put a new contract in place before December 31, 2015.

- In December of 2014 the IGU board approved the award of a sole source contract to RJG for \$31,800.00 to provide accounting services. The services under this contract include processing of payment transactions, monthly presentation of financial statements to the finance committee, reconciliation of AIDEA quarterly line of credit reports to the financial information, a full disclosure compilation for the two years ending June 30, 2015, development of written procedures to comply with FY14 Audit recommendations and availability as needed to respond to any Audit requests for
- information regarding FY 15.
- The basis for the original single source justification was that RJG completed the IGU's FY14 financials, and that RJG was uniquely positioned to undertake the work based on their previous experience with the IGU accounting records and there wasn't sufficient time to solicit, award the contract, and transition to any other accounting firm. RJG is still uniquely qualified based on the time it would take to bring another contractor up to speed and RJG already having an understanding
- of IGU's needs.
- At the time of the original single source request the IGU intended to develop a scope of services to solicit an RFP for a longer term contract for accounting services in early May. However as a result of changes in the make-up of the IGU board, delays in recruiting for a full time GM and CFO, and the uncertainty regarding the scope of long term accounting services given the potential for changes in scope in the next few years it was not practical to issue an RFP for a long term contract at this
- 30 time.
- 31 Accounting services are services that, for the long term, need to be competitively solicited and the
- 32 current plan is to issue an RFP once a new CFO is hired and the required long-term services can be
- 33 properly scoped. However, at this point in IGU's development, it is recommended that RJG
- 34 continue as a sole source contractor to provide these monthly accounting services for the period July
- 35 1, 2015 to December 31, 2015. It is recommended that the sole source contract to RJG be increased
- 36 by \$22,000 for a total amount not to exceed \$53,800.

Code of Ethics for the IGU Board AS OF 6 June, 2015

A. Purpose and Intent. Members serving on the IGU Board provide their time and energy in public service to the Board and exercise significant personal commitment, often at substantial financial sacrifice in terms of time taken from other professional endeavors. The appointed and elected members are expected and permitted to earn a living and hold individual financial interests. However, matters coming before the Board may include matters in which the appointed or elected member or a family member has a financial or private interest creating ethical issues which should be regulated in order to ensure that decisions of IGU rest solely on what is in the public's interest.

B. General Prohibited Conduct. No person serving on the IGU Board shall:

- 1. Solicit, offer or receive money or other item of value in return for a vote, or the exercise of the person's official duties.
- 2. Offer or accept any money or other item of value for or in consideration of obtaining employment, appointment, or promotion of any person by IGU.
- 3. Offer or accept any money or other item of value for or in consideration of the use of the person's public position to obtain a contract for any person or business with IGU.
- 4. Use for the person's own benefit, or for the benefit of another, confidential information acquired by reason of the person's IGU position and which is not available to the public.
- 5. Disclose or release, confidential information acquired as a Board member or from the person's official duties unless authorized by law, by a Board majority, or order of the court.
- 6. Divert or permit the diversion of IGU personnel time, IGU services, vehicles, equipment, materials or other property for a purpose unrelated to IGU business.
- 7. Accept a gift from an individual or an entity with interests that may be substantially affected by the performance of the person's official IGU's duties under circumstances where the timing and nature of the gift would cause a reasonable person to question the person's judgment in exercising official IGU duties on a matter affecting the donor.
- 8. Accept gifts from persons on a basis so frequent as to raise an appearance of the use of the person's IGUs position for private gain.

- 9. State or suggest to another person that official action or vote on any IGU matter is conditioned on the retention or non-retention of services, including without limitation professional services, construction, and the procurement of supplies, from another person or entity.
- **C. IGU Exercising Monetary or Management Discretion.** When action on a matter involves monetary discretion in the recommendation of policy or funding, IGU Board members shall disclose any financial interest or personal involvement in the matter, including a summary of personal contacts.
- **D. Disclosure Requirements.** IGU Board members shall place the public interest above any financial or private interest when taking official action. If a Board Member's private relationships or interests prevent the member from placing the public interest above a financial or private interest, the Board member shall disclose this fact on the record. Prior to comment, deliberation or decision on a matter coming before the IGU Board, a member shall disclose any financial or private interest in the matter, including the financial interest or personal involvement of an immediate family member as defined in FNSBC 2.25.200. The nature of the financial or private interest shall be disclosed in sufficient detail to permit the other members of the IGU Board to determine if the financial interest is substantial or the personal involvement is prejudicial. If the other members of the IGU Board, by majority vote, determine that a financial interest is substantial or the personal involvement is prejudicial, the member may not participate in the matter coming before the IGU Board.
- **E. Substantial Financial Interest.** Whether the financial or private interest disclosed is substantial shall be determined by the Board on a case-by-case basis, with evaluation of these factors:
- 1. Whether the financial or private interest is a substantial part of the matter under consideration;
- 2. Whether the financial or private interest directly and substantially varies with the outcome of the official action;
- 3. Whether the financial or private interest is immediate and known or conjectural and dependent on factors beyond the official action;
 - 4. Whether the financial or private interest is significant monetarily;
- 5. Whether the financial or private interest is of a type which is generally possessed by the public or a large class of persons to which the member belongs.

- 6. Other factors deemed appropriate by the chair under the specifics of the disclosure and the nature of the action before the appointed body.
- **F. Restrictions on Employment**. It is a conflict of interest for a Board Member to represent, advise, or assist a person for compensation regarding a matter that was under consideration by the Board if the member participated personally in the matter through the exercise of official duty.
- **G. Written Disclosure of Present Economic Interest.** All Board Members shall disclose any economic interest that could cause the official to have a personal or financial interest in the decisions of the board. The Board member shall file supplemental written statements with the Board as new interests are acquired, and make disclosures on the record of potential conflicts as required when matters come before the IGU Board.
- **H. Acquisition of an Economic Interest in Board Contracts and Business.** If a Board member or a member of the immediate family is defined in FNSBC 2.25.200 Can't take any official action with respect to preparation of the solicitation, award, or administration of a contract, the member or a member of the immediate family shall not acquire directly or indirectly an economic interest in a related IGU contract.
- **I. Gifts.** Gifts to a member of the Board, unrelated to the service, and gifts without monetary value are not covered. Unless subject to supplemental restrictions governing the Board, these unsolicited gifts are allowed and subject to disclosure as follows:
- 1. A gift or award of monetary value presented in recognition of meritorious, civic, or voluntary service to the Board, so long as presented by a recognized civic or non-profit charitable organization presenting such a gift or award as part of an established tradition, and not given as financial inducement for official action. A member of the Board shall disclose a gift or award with a monetary value in excess of \$50.00 and file the disclosure with the Board within 30 working days of receipt of the gift or award.
- 2. A perishable gift for immediate consumption or display, from member(s) of the public, expressing general appreciation or holiday cheer, when shared among members of the Board or donated to charity. Board Members shall disclose a gift under this category with a value in excess of \$150.00 and file the disclosure with the borough clerk within 30 working days of receipt.
- **J. Political Activity.** A member of the Board shall not:
- 1. Use official position to solicit a contribution, endorsement, or other campaign support for any political candidate.

- 2. Use official position to discourage or inhibit any person from exercising voter franchise.
- 3. Act in a manner to suggest that the member is acting in the member's official capacity or otherwise representing the Board, when engaging in political activity during personal time.



Suggested rewrite to I.

- **I. Allowable Gifts.** Gifts to a member of the Board that are unrelated to Board service and gifts without monetary value are not prohibited. In addition, the following unsolicited gifts are allowed subject to disclosure as follows:
- 1. A gift or award of monetary value presented in recognition of meritorious, civic, or voluntary service to the Board, so long as presented by a recognized civic or non-profit charitable organization presenting such a gift or award as part of an established tradition, and not given as financial inducement for official action. A member of the Board shall disclose a gift or award with a monetary value in excess of \$50.00 and file the disclosure with the Board within 30 working days of receipt of the gift or award.
- 2. A perishable gift for immediate consumption or display, from member(s) of the public, expressing general appreciation or holiday cheer, when shared among members of the Board or donated to charity. Board Members shall disclose a gift under this category with a value in excess of \$150.00 and file the disclosure with the borough clerk within 30 working days of receipt.
